Help Protect the Vote Count


No matter what state or county you live in, contact your election office **now** to arrange to be a nonpartisan observer.

Did you know that in most places the processing and counting of votes is open for observation, yet historically hardly anyone shows up?

State vote counts are usually conducted at the county level. Pennsylvania, for example, has 67. — Our aim is to have nonpartisan observers in most of these counties.

There will be more observers from all sides for this election. Your very presence can serve as a civil, calming influence. Nonpartisan election observers "can increase public confidence in well-run elections," as the National Conference of State Legislators says.

Your job before election night is to determine which activities you will be able to observe on election night, or in the following days and weeks, **and get the appropriate training.**



Get Post-Election Observer Training

As an independent observer, you can be the eyes of the public in making sure the vote count is being conducted fairly, and security precautions are being followed.

Scrutineers is a nonpartisan organization offering **free training** to volunteers to observe the vote count & other election procedures after Nov 8.

NVRTF is partnering with Scrutineers to recruit and train volunteers.
